While searching the B. y's far papers - four lovines of RIC and B-T's travelling from wicklow or hex for a to Depot armed on some and opened fine. a severe engagement ensued and after about 5 mints the hold up party and 4 prisoners were lucky to have made their escape unscatted Shortly after the Lines came into aperation on 11th July 1921 Training Comps were set up in each leanpany area for N. C. o's - and men. a Battahon leamy, under Camaa, was Organisea Job Barnacullia, Sandyford and all officers and series N. 6.00 received an intensive training there our a period of several weeks. The Battahin and Company appriors also attended I the Brigade leaving at Glenasmale. Defore concluding this statement Iwaned like to pay a tribute to the gallantry, self-sample and devotion of the Volunteers of this difficulty with whom the hander to serve, particularly -Dick Doyle, Jan Cardiff, Pat Quin, Denis Kenny,
