While the material may have been regarded as of signals' interest, its primary value is that it provides minutiae of activities and incidents enerated within, or affecting, the various commands. The historian should find that it omplements other Civil War documentation. With regard to its 'Signals' relevance, one can say that the volume of traffic and the distribution and quality of the messages indicate the existence of an underlying efficient and reliable nationwide wireless telegraphy network, perated by a highly efficient staff.

The message from Adj Gen to C Athlone 30 September 1922 regarding "Question to the Minister for Defence" is of erest. It concerns the ill treatment by troops of the stationmaster, Balla, county Mayo, for imple five days and nights in a stable.







## Radio and Phone Reports received in C.S. Office and circulated

Scope and Content

Reports include reference to funeral of Liam Lynch at Mitchelstown, see report dated 16 April, bank raid and robbery, mail car raided 14 April, bank raid, hold-up of bread van and its destruction over a cliff and capture of irregulars 16 April. Message from Kerry Command regarding siege in Clash, in causeway area 16 April; covered in several messages. Message dated 21 April, Kerry Command: Query, Press reports of cave siege did not mention that three of the prisoners had previously signed the Form of Undertaking. Dublin Command 17 April Arms Dump in Dalkey, also in Glenageary. 20 April station at Chapel burnt to ground. 17 April reference to capture of Dan Breen and others. Dublin Command, 22 April, dead body of an unknown man riddled with bullets found in Grace Park Road, Drumcondra: further message identifies the body. 23 April dead body of an irregular discovered outside Sneem, Kenmare: an execution. 23 April murder of "convicted spy" by irregulars. 23 April Pte Clancy shot dead on patrol. 23 April arrest of a Miss Browne and a Miss O'Toole of Priory Street, New Ross. 23 April depicts much miscellaneous activities in Cork area. 23 April, escape of 71 prisoners by means of tunnel from Tintown No.1, the Curragh. 25 April, trial by a committee of officers and subsequent execution at Tralee Jail of three named prisoners. 25 April surrender of prominent irregular members of Aeroplane Lyons Column. 26 April significant number of arrests carried out 24th are detailed. 26 April two Protestant schools burnt. 27 April two officers and two guards satisfactorily settled land dispute. On return journey to Castleisland they were attacked by 30 men under command of Humphrey Murphy, one officer killed. Guards stripped and released. 27 April, Dublin Command, Grand Central Dance Hall and Picture House O'Connell Street, blown up by mine. 28 April, series of arrests throughout Limerick Command detailed. 27 April large ammunition dump found in Lissarda. 28 April commandeering of car of State Solicitor for Waterford City. 27 April accidental killing of Cpl of 17 Inf Bn. 28 April burning down of Durrow Abbey between Tullamore and Kilbeggan. 29 April, the Hon Albinia Broderick, sister of Lord Midleton, captured wounded. 26 April, burning of Lord Killarin's residence at Spiddal. 29 April, circumstances of wounding of Hon Albinia Broderick. 28 April, details of arms dump discovered near Beal na Blath. 29 April, robbing of stamps and Postal Orders Dromohair post office. 30 April Dublin Command, Clongowes Wood post office, seizure of cash and dog licences. 30 April Dublin Command, raid 24 Marguerite Road, Glasnevin. Materials captured included signalling apparatus. 3 May Dublin Command "Back to the Land" organisation activities on farm at Bressogue, Athboy. 3 May, motor car with two nuns fired on. 2 May, capture of notorious irregular leader John Griffin, known as "Gilpin", at Sneem. 3 May, interesting report of some activities by troops against irregulars in Kerry Command. 4 May, collection for irregulars of Easter dues belonging to parish priest and of dog licences. 4 May, Claremorris Command, arrest of five young ladies in Headford district. 6 May Dublin Command, residence of Senator Martin Fitzgerald, Ardlee, Dundrum attacked for two hours, no casualties.
