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Scope and Content	The following is a resume of a collection of files containing radio and telephone (but predominantly radio) reports generated within the Army during the years 1922 to 1924 and centred on the period of the Civil War. While the material may have been regarded as of 'Signals' interest, its primary value is that it provides minutiae of activities and incidents generated within, or affecting, the various commands. The historian should find that it complements other Civil War documentation. With regard to its 'Signals' relevance, one can say that the volume of traffic and the distribution and quality of the messages indicate the existence of an underlying efficient and reliable nationwide wireless telegraphy network, operated by a highly efficient staff.

The selection of the material for each summary is solely that of the writer and hence is unavoidably subjective: nevertheless, it is hoped that some useful pointers and guidelines have been provided for the researcher. The boxes were, on first inspection, found to be identified by pencil markings, CW/R/1, CW/R/2, CW/R/4 and CW/R/5, thus indicating the possibility of the existence of a further box.

Many of the messages are important. Most would need to be correlated with other sources, if possible, so as to understand the background to the events reported upon. The message from Adj Gen to GOC Athlone 30 September 1922 regarding "Question to the Minister for Defence" is of interest. It concerns the ill treatment by troops of the stationmaster, Balla, county Mayo, for example five days and nights in a stable.
